Staff sit with the children and enjoy a Christmas dinner with all the trimmings, with crackers, hats and festive music. If your child does not usually stay for dinner but you would like them to join us for dinner for a cost of £2.30, please let Miss Bond know before Friday 11th November.



This year we have combined our Christmas Dinner Day with Christmas Jumper day. Children are welcome to wear a Christmas Jumper / T-shirt or non-uniform if they prefer.

We hope by combining the two events our Christmas Dinner Day will be extra festive!

Santa's Grotto at Spennymoor Town Hall

Children will be visiting Santa on **Monday 12th December** at 10:00 a.m.

We plan to walk to Spennymoor Town Hall (around 30 minutes) and back again. We will be leaving at approximately 09:30 a.m.

As the children are so young we need lots of volunteers in order for the visit to go ahead. Unfortunately if we do not have enough volunteers the visit will need to be cancelled and we will try to make

alternative arrangements. With this in mind we will not be telling the children about the visit until we have confirmed numbers.

Therefore we would like to kindly ask if there are any parents that can come with us for this lovely experience. If you are able to join us or have additional family members (e.g. Grandparent, Auntie, Uncle) who would be willing to volunteer please let Miss Bond know. We will need final numbers by Friday 18th November so that we can make arrangements.

Every child is given a present from Santa- this is usually a selection box!



<u>Party day</u>

This year's Christmas party day will be on **Wednesday 14th December**.

Children can come in wearing their party clothes— but please remember to still bring a coat and sensible shoes in case we go outside!

Fundraising

We will be selling reindeer dust and reindeer hot chocolate during December to help raise money for our school fund. We use this money to help pay for ingredients to make playdough and to bake with the children. As well as subsidising visits to keep costs down for parents.

We will also be running a chocolate and bottle tombola. If you have any chocolates, sweets or bottles that you would like to donate, please give

them to Miss Bond. The bottles can be alcoholic, non-alcoholic, or other types of bottles such as shampoo etc! Tickets will be available to buy during our Christmas Nativity performances for £1.00 a strip and the winners will be picked after the final performance.



What are we learning this half-term?

This half term we will be learning celebrating:

- Bonfire Night (with toasted marshmallows)
- Christmas

Children are now developing their self-help skills and many of our children can put on their own coats and wellies. We will be continuing to practise these skills as well as doing up zips independently.



For our new starters, we have a big focus on sharing stories and learning nursery rhymes with numbers up to five such as Five Little Speckled Frogs, Five Little Ducks etc. We are spending lots of time ensuring that they get used to our rules and routines and joining in with group activities.

For our children who have been with us a little longer we will be listening for rhyming words in stories. We will also be looking at patterns and practising counting using one to one correspondence.

Lots of our children are still learning how to take turns and share toys. This is a completely normal stage of their development. We encourage children to solve problems like this by playing games with their friends with some adult support and using words such as 'my turn, your turn'.



Forest School

Forest school will take a short break from the week commencing the 14th November to allow for Christmas activities to take place.

It will restart in the new year with group sessions taking place as normal.
