What are we learning this half term?

Our topic this half term will be based around 'growth' so children will be planting seeds and learning about what they need to grow. We will be a having a sunflower competition to see who can grow the tallest sunflower. We will also be learning about mini-beasts and exploring our garden to see if we can find any!

Our school leavers will continue learning about the sounds that letters make through our phonics scheme Read, Write, inc. Our younger children will be enjoying pre-phonics games to develop their listening and attention skills.


In maths, as well as developing our understanding of number we will be learning about height. We will be using mathematical language to describe different objects, such as tall and short. We will also be comparing different objects, talking about tallest, shortest, taller and shorter.

This term we are also focusing on self help skills to support children in their transition to school. This includes things such as putting on their own shoes and coats and trying to do things before asking an adult for help.
