
World Book Day- Thursday 7th March



To celebrate this year's World Book Day, please can your child come into nursery wearing their pyjamas (warm ones please!) and bring a teddy and their favourite book. We will run lots of sessions throughout the day for children to share their stories and cuddle up with their teddy.

<u>Book Fair</u>

To further promote our love of reading, we have teamed up with Scholastic books to have a book fair in school from Tuesday 12th March until Friday 15th March.



All children will be given a £1 off voucher (to celebrate World Book Day) that can be used at the fair. The fair will be open before and after school, but you can also order online. A percentage of any books bought will also go towards our school fund which helps pay for lots of lovely activities that we do in Nursery.

Easter Stay and Play



Every Easter, we celebrate with children by decorating Easter bonnets and performing some Easter songs too. We will be holding a 'Stay and Play' session on Tuesday 26th March from 3.00pm-4.30pm for you to come and join in with some Easter activities and see your child sing.

We would also like to invite you to come and decorate your child's Easter bonnet with them in school. School will provide the bonnets and decorations. We have the following sessions available for you to sign up to:

Monday 11th March to Friday 15th March– 8:45am to 9.30am and 2:30pm to 3:30pm

We also have a later slot available on Wednesday 13th March until 5:00pm.



Don't worry if you can't attend any of these sessions, please let a staff member know and they will decorate a bonnet with your child during their usual nursery sessions.

Chocolate Tombola

We will be holding a chocolate tombola on Wednesday 20th March to help raise funds for our summer party. You can buy tickets on the day from 7:45am to 9:15am. If there are any left we will continue to sell tickets at home time but please be aware they may go quickly! If you are able to donate any Easter eggs or chocolate, we would appreciate this. Please hand them in to the school office no later than Friday 15th March.



What are we learning this half-term?

Our main theme this half term is traditional tales. We will be reading:

- Jack and the Beanstalk
- The Gingerbread Man
- Goldilocks and the Three Bears

We will also be celebrating Mother's Day and Easter with the children.



In Maths we are focusing on numbers up to 10 (and beyond) and what these numbers represent. We will be teaching 2D and 3D shapes and children will be making their own patterns.

We will be using the garden to develop children's physical skills through climbing, ball play and using the parachute. Children will have the opportunity to apply and further develop these gross motor skills through dance and gymnastic in P.E. sessions. We are doing lots of work to develop fine motor skills too which will help children to be able to hold a pencil properly and start to write recognisable letters.

We're always here to help you with any concerns that you may have. Even if we don't know the answer, we can always point you to someone who will be able to help.



An offer will be sent to parents and carers on Tuesday 16th April 2023 through the online account you created when you submitted your child's application. You can log in to see the school your child has been offered.

If you wish to accept the place, you do not need to do anything– your child's place is automatically accepted. If you are not happy with the place your child has been offered, you will need to contact school admissions.
